MISCHLER EMBRACES LARGER ROLE WITH CLUB, SCHOOL

Often when a quarterback is drafted into the National Football League, no matter how hyped they are, they will sit for a year or two and watch and learn from veteran starters.

Megan Mischler can relate.

With three seniors and a junior in front of her when she arrived at West Virginia University last fall Mischler was able to ease into the college game, normally playing anywhere from 10 to 30 minutes off the bench in a given game.

But her time has come.

This spring, Mischler moved into the starting lineup at WVU, scoring seven goals against college and international competition. Similarly, her role with the West Virginia Illusion has put her front-and-center; she's played all 270 minutes so far this season at forward.

"That's what I'm used to from high school and club and even the regional team, so I'm ready to step back into that role," she said.

It's also given her a chance to work on the objectives given to her by WVU head coach Nikki Izzo-Brown as well as Illusion boss Joe Dorini.

"[Nikki] just wants me to get stronger on the ball. Working with my back toward goal is something I know I need to work on as well," said Mischler. "She wants me taking shots and getting used to my role."

Despite the team's slow start, Mischler is hopeful for the future.

"It's exciting to play against such good competition throughout the country like this, and I think we can get competitive as soon as we play together more. I don't think we're on par with what we're capable of right now, but we're getting better with our practices and getting more intensity."
